

SPRING SOLO AND ENSEMBLE FESTIVAL 2020

Congratulations! Your student has expressed an interest in participating in Solo & Ensemble Festival. This festival is optional, but it is a valuable experience for student musicians provided to us by the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association. Since this festival is an extra commitment, you will want to sit down with your student to talk about participation in the festival.

What is Solo Ensemble Festival?

7th and 8th grade instrumentalists from all over the W. Michigan area prepare and perform a solo or small group piece. They perform this piece in a classroom for a qualified judge who provides them with feedback, suggestions, and a rating. This gives the kids an opportunity to work on musical independence while improving their skills at the individual level.

Where is it at?

The festival will be held at Northpointe Christian Schools. Maps will be provided. Transportation is not provided.

When is Solo Ensemble Festival?

The spring festival will be on Saturday, April 18, 2020. Please check your calendars now for availability, so as to avoid ensembles depending on students who will be out of town. Students will perform some time between 8 am and 5 pm. A specific time slot will be given to students a couple weeks before the festival.

How do we find music to play?

The band directors may help students find appropriate music. If your child takes private lessons, they should have their private instructor select music. **The piece must be a minimum of 1 minute and 30 seconds long and must be an original purchased piece of music** (no photocopies). If students do not take private lessons, they will need to do a couple of after school rehearsals with Mrs. Gembis or Mr. Palma, but the great majority of practicing will have to be done outside of class on their own.

Will my student need a piano accompanist?

All soloists (with the exception of some percussion music) will need a piano accompanist. This is required in the rules of S&E Festival, and this person plays along with your student as they play through their solo. They provide all of the harmony to make a solo sound great! Deb Alley will be the accompanist that works with our kids at school. If you have a strong preference to provide your own accompanist, please have your child talk to Mrs. Gembis.

What is the cost?

Yes, there is a fee. Solos cost \$15, and all ensembles are \$10 per student (duets \$20 or \$10 per student; trios \$30 or \$10 per student, etc). Therefore, a student playing a solo and a quintet would pay \$25. A student doing just a solo will pay \$15. Solos will require an additional fee for the piano accompanist which you will pay the accompanist directly, approximately \$30. This covers the cost of time spent during rehearsals and the performance.
